Challenge/Homework Project: Create a Family Tree

English

Reading will be a focus during guided reading sessions; children will be given the strategies and skills to develop into fluent, independent readers. During English and publishing lessons children will focus on developing their writing abilities and will advance in their understanding of different genres. There will be a focus on editing where the children develop critical thinking skills enabling them to change their work so that it is more effective and fit for purpose. Within this term we will cover letters, newspaper reports. narrative, explanation and poetry. In addition, spelling and grammar will have a weekly focus.

Science Materials (Mixtures, solutions and changes):

How can I compare and group materials depending on their properties? What are thermal conductors and insulators and how can I test and compare them? How can I collect results and draw conclusions from my scientific enquiry into thermal conductors and insulators? How do I investigate the best electrical conductors? Which electrical conductors make a bulb shine brightest? How do I draw conclusions from my investigation into the best electrical conductors? Which material was the best electrical conductor and why?

Maths

We will focus on developing a deep and thorough understanding of the four operations. Calculation will involve whole numbers. fractions, decimals and percentages and will initiate understanding of the links between these. Another focus will be on the importance of knowing place value securely. Children will work on their problem solving by developing an understanding of mathematical vocabulary. They will be able to reason mathematically by discussing methods chosen. Basic arithmetic skills will be developed in preparation for Year 6.

Humanities:

Vikings vs Anglo-Saxon:

How do I explore what Britain was like before the first Viking invasions? How do I find out about the Viking invasions of Britain? How do I find out about the Viking settlement of Britain and how this affected the Anglo-Saxons? How do I find out why King Alfred the dubbed 'Alfred the Great'? How do I explore what life was like for Vikings living in Britain? How do I find out how and when England became a unified country? How do I find out about the end of the Anglo-Saxon and Viking era in Britain?
