

Year 3 Home Learning Grid – Spring 1

Below are 15 home learning tasks for your child to complete during the half term. There are 5 tasks for Maths and English and 5 creative tasks to choose from. Each child is expected to complete six tasks over the term. Two from each curriculum area. We appreciate that some weekends are busier than others; therefore, we are giving you the flexibility to complete tasks in your own time. Instead of checking weekly we have decided to take homework books in over half term to monitor progress with home learning.

Please ensure your child returns their home learning book to school in the last week of term.

<p>Take a picture of your favourite teddy bear or soft toy in different positions in your house.</p> <p>For each photo write a sentence using a preposition to explain where the teddy is.</p> <p>For example: The teddy is on top of the table. The teddy is beneath the bed.</p>	<p>Solve the puzzle to find the value of each piece of fruit.
