


Home Learning Grid – Spring 1


Below are 15 home learning tasks for your child to complete during the half term. There are 5 tasks for Maths and English and 5 creative tasks to choose from. Each child is expected to complete six tasks over the term. Two from each curriculum area. We appreciate that some weekends are busier than others; therefore, we are giving you the flexibility to complete tasks in your own time. Instead of checking weekly we have decided to take homework books in over half term to monitor progress with home learning. Please ensure your child returns their home learning book to school in the last week of term.

English	Maths	Creative
<p>We use a lot of homophones in English, can you come with some clever ways to tell them apart.</p> <p>e.g.</p> 	<p>You have 2 minutes to find as many items as possible that begin with the letter A. Record the score in your book.</p> <p>Repeat again with each letter of the alphabet.</p> <p>How many letters can you complete?</p> <p>Which letter did you find the most objects for?</p>	<p>In Art this term, we will be learning about the artist, David Hockney.</p> <p>Hockney, uses lots of different photos to make one big picture. This is called a montage. Create a photomontage of someone or something that is important to you.</p> 
<p>Write a poem about Spring. Think about the features of poetry we have learnt including:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Rhythm2. Rhyme3. Repetition4. Onomatopoeia5. Metaphors6. Similes7. Personification	<p>We are beginning to work with fractions this term. Find and use items around your home to make some fractions.</p> <p>e.g.</p> 	<p>In Science this term, we will be learning about electricity.</p> <p>Make a list of all the electrical devices in your home and create a table sorting them by how they get their power. By battery or by mains.</p>
<p>Write an in-depth character description of Arthur, Fenrir and Thor from our class book, Arthur and the Golden Rope.</p> 	<p>My answer is</p> <p>96</p> <p>What was my question?</p> <p>Think of as many possibilities as you can.</p>	<p>Explore the Northern Lights. You could:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Create a piece of artwork2. Research project3. Write a report about them

1. Description of the setting.
2. Use your 5 senses.
3. Try to use atmosphere, similes, personification and metaphors.
