UNICEF is the world's leading organisation working for children and their rights. In 1989, governments worldwide promised all children the same rights by adopting the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC). These rights are based on what a child needs to survive, grow, participate and fulfil their potential.

Article 12—Every Child has the right to give their opinion and for an adult to listen and take it seriously.

Article 19—Every child has the right to be protected from being hurt and mistreated, in body or in mind.

- Adults in the playground during playtime and lunchtimes
- Trained First Aid Staff
- Learning Mentor for children to talk to
- All staff have agreed to, and signed the Safeguarding Policy
- Have a worry box for children to voice how they feel and raise any concerns
- Safe and clean classrooms and playgrounds





Article 24—Every child has the right to the best health care possible, safe water to drink, nutritious food and a clean and safe environment

- Providing healthy school meals
- Access to safe water to drink inside the classroom and outside
- Keep all areas, clean and tidy so they are safe
- Play safely with equipment
- Hosting fundraising events to help others
- E-Safety lessons for all children
- E-Safety contract agreement forms for children

# Article 26—Every child has the right to a good quality education.

- Teaching good/outstanding lessons to all children
- Setting personalised targets to support all learners
- Providing opportunities for children to work with their partners and in small groups where they learn from each other
- Providing children with feedback
- Setting weekly homework
- Providing interventions
- Creating an exciting curriculum

# Article 29—Every child has the right to use and develop their talents and abilities
