During lockdown we provided PE activities each week including a live lesson.

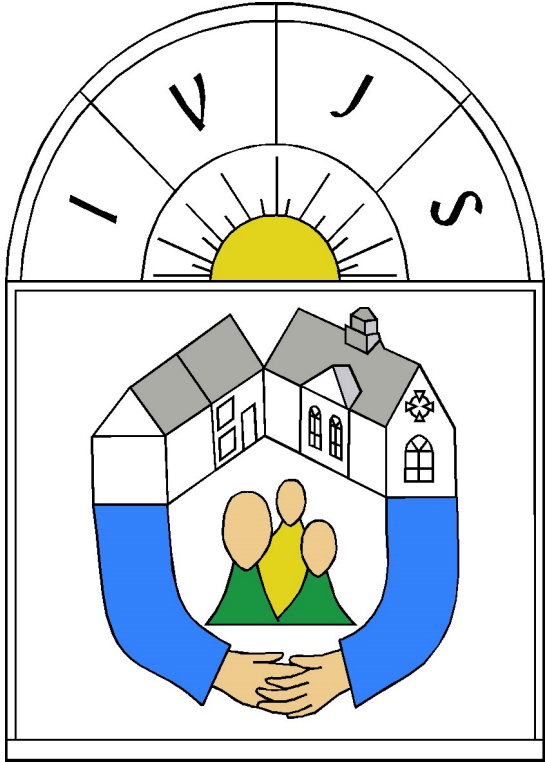
## This term we will...
