### This Week In School...

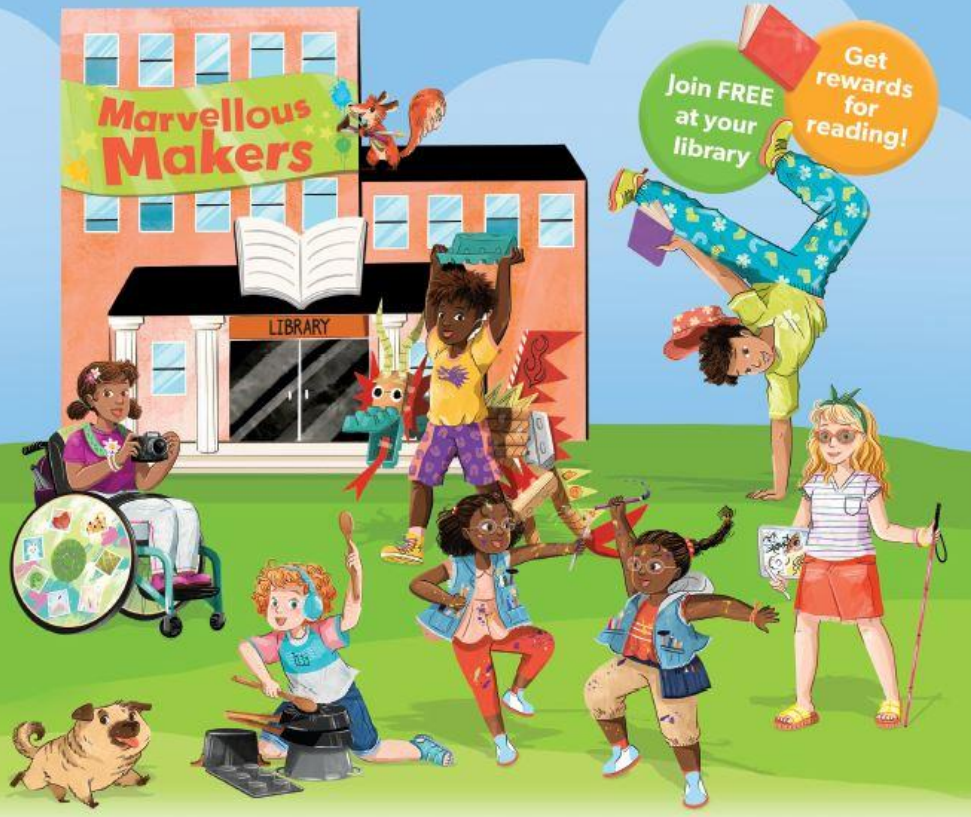
