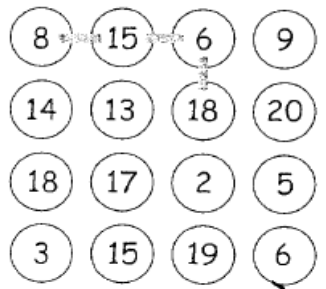


Join any four numbers.
