

SATs Official Results!

New primary school league table data for England has been published by the Department for Education.

The tables are based on how 11-year-olds in each school performed in national curriculum tests - or SATs - taken at the end of primary school. They provide a snapshot of how well each school is performing and tracks pupils' progress.

The aim is to hold schools to account and to give parents a way of comparing schools in their areas. The tables allow you to filter the list by county and we are very pleased to see how we have performed against other Buckinghamshire schools.

Looking at the progress measure for each subject we are 13th for Maths, 14th for Writing and 27th for Reading out of 222 Buckinghamshire schools. Our scores for Maths and Reading are 'above average'.


1st - Pinewood
