### Railway Safety

Network Rail are busy modernising the Great Western route to create faster, more reliable services, better stations and increased freight capacity. This is the biggest investment in the Great Western railway since Brunel built it more than 150 years ago. As part of the Railway Upgrade Programme, the railway lines in our area - between West Drayton and Maidenhead - will shortly be electrified in preparation for electric train services starting in 2016 and Crossrail services in 2019. The safety of people on and around the railway is a priority and education in railway safety is key; especially for young people. As a result of this, Years 5 and 6 will be learning about electrification on the railway, level crossings and general railway safety on Thursday 9th June.



### Homework Project For WaterAid

Every minute, every day, people suffer and lives are lost needlessly because of a lack of safe water and sanitation. With this in mind, the final charity we will be supporting this year will be Water Aid. Children will be designing a label for a water bottle to help their class collect loose change. Eco-school will then judge this competition and choose the winning label for each class and the overall winner will be displayed in reception ready to start raising money.

We will also be having a water themed mufti day on 14<sup>th</sup> July where the children can use their imagination to come up with water inspired costumes for example mermaids, pirates, fish or even a lifeguard! Alternatively you could wear something blue for the day.

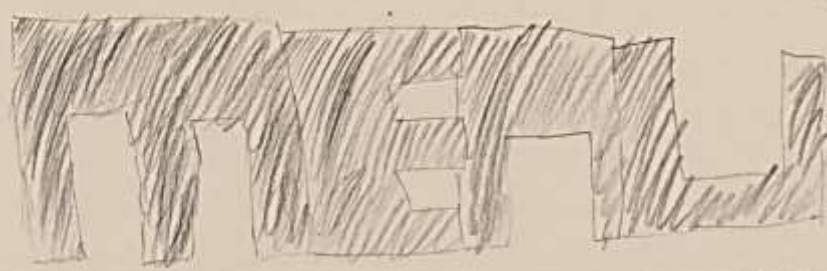
