This Week In School...

Year 6 – have been renewing their focus on their writing and have produced some lovely poems about Spring at IVJS. 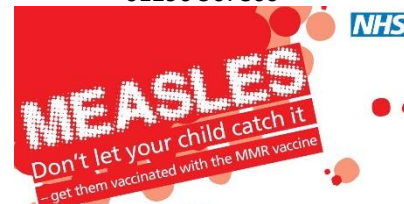
