Secondary School Deadlines and 11+

Online applications are being taken on the admissions section of the www.bucks.cc.gov.uk website. The deadline for applications for first round allocations is 31st October however we recommend you get your applications in by 21st October to give the council time to acknowledge that they have received the application. Please note that **Grammar schools have set their deadline for moving into the area** as 1st October but the deadline for their applications is still 31st October.

The Year 6 11+ transfer test results will be sent out on 16th October.

Bikeability


