Science Museum Trip

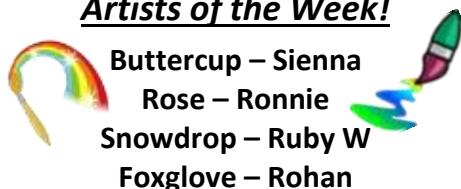
Year 5 will be heading off to the Science Museum after the half term. For anyone who has yet to return their permission slips and money, please do so by Monday 30th January. Thank you.

To begin with you can help us by:

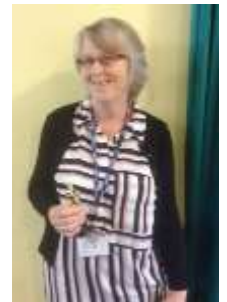
- Keeping our school gates clear of parked cars
