We Won A Bronze Award!

We are the first of the Sapere EEF schools to receive a Bronze award! We are one of 200 schools across England taking part in the Education Endowment Foundation's (EEF) study into the effectiveness of SAPERE P4C (Philosophy for Children). This study follows on from the EEF's first efficacy trial, which found that SAPERE P4C has a positive influence on education and wider outcomes, particularly for disadvantaged students. Additional research, funded by the Nuffield Foundation, also found that SAPERE P4C has important non-cognitive benefits, including boosting communication and teamwork skills, particularly for disadvantaged pupils.
